
So, as we continue down our perceived path of life, we really never know which way the wind may take us. We can only trim our sails and hold fast to each other, for where one goes we all go.

RBOC Report Jack R. Michael President 2013

As I write this report, we just finished an RBOC Board Meeting. There are not many changes from my report last month, other than bills have moved to other committees as the process moves on! I suggest that you go to the RBOC website, rboc.org, and click on the "Boater Brief" heading for the Summer Boater Brief. This provides a bit more detail than my report last month.

You may recall an issue we had last year with the Sheriff's Association regarding the use of recreational boater generated funds to finance removal of abandoned commercial vessels. The Sheriff's Association has been surveying the existence of derelict, abandoned vessels in the Delta and have documented considerably more than previously thought. concern is the abandoned commercial vessels, since commercial vessel owners do not contribute any funding to address this issue. However, there is another issue involved and that is that some derelict "commercial vessels" are really private vessels which have also not contributed funding for abandoned vessel cleanup. This funding now comes solely from the fuel taxes paid by recreational boaters. We will be having more discussions with the Sheriff's Association to find some solution to this problem.

Enjoy the boating season and look for hopefully more information in my report next month!


